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Executive Summary

The Center for Innovation, Partnership, and Community Engagement (CIPC) is a newly established center under Alfaisal University, with a mission to utilize academia to better serve the community through innovative methods while engaging faculty and students. The CIPC is working closely and in line with Alfaisal University's Corporate Social Responsibility office, Student Affairs, and Alfaisal's Business Center. The CIPC aims to eventually become a national benchmark for effective community engagement and innovative partnerships between healthcare and academia. The CIPC is committed to fostering non-technology-based innovation and enhancing academic and research activities to better serve the community. This report provides an overview of CIPC's vision, mission, values, potential projects, workshops, book club, and discussion points raised during the CIPC meetings.

Over the course of the year so far, CIPC has launched several new programs and initiatives, such as the first-ever intra-university community engagement workshop called "Let's Talk Community WORKshoPotluck", and other initiatives such as the AU Book Joggers, Women's Day, and Alfaisal Sunday Runs. We have also supported other bodies at Alfaisal, including 'Wings of Hope'. These programs have been successful in promoting collaboration between students, faculty, and the community, as well as fostering innovative ideas and solutions to address real-world problems.

I. Introduction

The Center for Innovation, Partnership, and Community Engagement (CIPC) was established to bridge the gap between the rapidly evolving trends in the healthcare system, academia, and community needs. The mission of the CIPC is to fulfill and facilitate progress towards Alfaisal University's mission and vision by utilizing academia to better serve the community through innovative methods, engaging faculty and students.

II. CIPC Vision, Mission, and Values

The CIPC's vision is to become a national benchmark for effective community engagement and innovative partnerships between healthcare and academia. The CIPC's mission is to utilize academia to better serve the community through innovative methods while engaging faculty and students. The CIPC values effective partnerships to innovatively engage the community through academia and research, empowering community-led non-technology-dependent innovative modalities, and embracing a process of continuous collaborative self-learning communication.

III. Pillars of the CIPC

A. Transformative Partnerships/ Advocacy:


The CIPC focuses on building partnerships with local, national, and international organizations to promote innovation and sustainable development. We are keen on fostering partnerships with organizations to achieve the goals of the CIPC.

Status:

Currently, we are working on creating a collaboration between the CIPC and the **Therapeutic Services Department at the Saudi Ministry of Health**. We will draft an **MoU** with them to increase our scope of clinical research and community engagement, and this partnership will also help us conduct patient-centered research. The Saudi MOH wishes for us to be involved in 1-2 megaprojects, and work on other smaller research projects in collaboration with them. They will be providing the materials and clinical data, and we will be doing the rest.



We are also involved with King Faisal Specialist Hospital & Research Centre's **Digital Health Conference 2023 (DHCon)** which will be held from May 16-17, 2023. Through our collaborative efforts, **Alfaisal University** is now an **Academic Partner** for the **Digital Health Conference** and will have a physical booth at the days of the event.



B. Innovative Education and Research:

Innovative Academic Programs

An example of such a project on the Academia axis is the **Health for All Interprofessional Course** which is being currently developed and could be a mandatory or elective course in the Introduction to Public Health offered to all colleges across the university. The purpose of this course is to form an interprofessional collaboration between different colleges and different students. For example, climate change is mainly medicine, but it involves many other disciplines like law, science, engineering, and pharmacy.

C. Research Domain:

Clinical Support Subcommittee (COM)

To facilitate and enhance the clinical research capabilities of Alfaisal University by fostering collaborations between the College of Medicine, Alfaisal University, and affiliated hospitals.

The Clinical Support Subcommittee (COM) will play a significant role in promoting research activities at the College of Medicine. COM has organized several meetings to support faculty and students' research projects. Over time, the subcommittee has added new members such as **Dr. Ali AlShehri, Deputy Director of Academic and Training Affairs, KFSH&RC**, who is now a permanent member of the subcommittee. The subcommittee has invited key researchers from King Faisal Specialist Hospital & Research Center (KFSH&RC) for their input and has created a vision, mission, and subcommittee objectives and goals.

During these meetings, various topics have been discussed, including the identification of mentors/research directors for research projects, ensuring the commitment and sustainability of research projects, how to increase clinical research projects at Alfaisal University, proposal for a student interest form to match students with appropriate projects, suggestion for research methodology training workshops for students, and discussing the structure and control of a special one-year program that covers research basics, analysis, and publication for students and researchers.

Furthermore, COM wishes to establish a process to ensure that the collaborative agreement document is signed by both primary investigators and the program director of the research if new students are joining an ongoing project. Additionally, KFSH wishes that we identify interested and committed students, and we discussed that a triage system be implemented to prioritize students who have the potential for commitment. To ensure compliance and commitment from both ends, the subcommittee plans to involve clerkship directors to facilitate communication.

Patient-Centered Research & Community-Centered Research (Consumer/End-User Level)

Research under this program will mainly include Patient-Centered Research and Community-Centered Research. Patient-Centered Outcomes Research helps patients and their caregivers communicate and make informed healthcare decisions, allowing their voices to be heard in assessing the value of healthcare options. Patient-centered research planning means developing research questions and outcome measures that are relevant to patients. Under this domain, researchers must determine which

patient populations and stakeholders to include in study design and then facilitate easy study participation. The research focuses attention on the patients' beliefs, preferences, and needs, in contrast to physician-centered care.

Faculty Research Mentorship Network (Researcher/Provider Level)

This will be a peer-assisted program where faculty who have either solid research ideas and/or data wish to conduct research and require the help of more research-experienced faculty to complete their projects. This will include adjunct faculty in clinical settings who have access to clinical data but are unsure of how to utilize the data or write up a research paper. We will be connecting faculty who can bridge the gap among each other and produce scientific studies together.

Primary Care Research Interest Group (Learner/Facilitator Level)

This will be an interest group where interested students from any level (alumni/interns/clerkship students/pre-clerkship students) who have an interest in primary care (internal medicine/family medicine/emergency medicine) research will be connected to a supervisor who will help design, allocate resources, and execute research projects under the program.

D. Community Engagement:


The CIPC strives to provide opportunities for Alfaisal University students, staff, and faculty to get involved in community engagement projects that make a positive impact on the local community.

Introduction


